This Act, most of which came into force in October 2014, made huge changes to a large range of areas of importance to the Local Authorities, Police and NHS bodies, as well as Housing Associations.

It altered a large number of existing powers including: ASBOs (although the Civil Injunction replacement is not yet in force), litter notices, DPPOs; dog control orders; licensed premises closures; dangerous dog powers.

It introduces much wider Community Involvement and new housing possession powers.

This course considers the most relevant parts in detail and will examine:

- The new powers
- The criteria for use
- The mechanisms and processes
- The effects
- Transitional arrangements from old to new

With plenty of time for discussion and practical examples, this course is a must for all those involved in Safer Communities, Anti-social behaviour teams, leisure services, hospital and community security, licensing, housing teams, dog wardens, as well as the police and lawyers.
