The Regulators Compliance Code came into effect on 6th April 2008, supplementing the Enforcement Concordat. The first part of this course explains its impact, and how your Authority can work with this important change to enforcement.

The second part considers the Regulatory Enforcement and Sanctions Act 2008 which will have a major impact on local authority enforcement, giving statutory powers to the Local Better Regulation Office (LBRO), allowing civil sanctions to replace criminal sanctions, placing a duty on local authorities not to impose or maintain unnecessary regulatory burdens and creating Primary Enforcement Authorities.

This course will examine these two interlinked areas. All managers and officers with enforcement responsibilities and local authority legal advisers need to be familiar with these new provisions, and the course is designed for them.
